### Bible Reading 1 John 4 v7 -21 (Good News Translation) God's Love and Ours

Dear friends, let us love one another, because love comes from God. Whoever loves is a child of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. And God showed his love for us by sending his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him. This is what love is: it is not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the means by which our sins are forgiven.

Dear friends, if this is how God loved us, then we should love one another. No one has ever seen God, but if we love one another, God lives in union with us, and his love is made perfect in us.

We are sure that we live in union with God and that he lives in union with us, because he has given us his Spirit. And we have seen and tell others that the Father sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. If we declare that Jesus is the Son of God, we live in union with God and God lives in union with us. And we ourselves know and believe the love which God has for us.

God is love, and whoever lives in love lives in union with God and God lives in union with him. Love is made perfect in us in order that we

may have courage on Judgment Day; and we will have it because our life in this world is the same as Christ's. There is no fear in love; perfect love drives out all fear. So then, love which has not been made perfect in anyone who is afraid, because fear has to do with punishment.

We love because God first loved us. If someone says he loves God,

but hates his brother, he is a liar. For he cannot love God, whom he has not seen, if he does not love his brother, whom he has seen.

The command that Christ has given us is this: whoever loves God must love his brother also.

## Reflection

Today's reading from 1 John has perhaps the greatest passage in the Bible on love: the love of God for the world, shown through his Son, is a love we should also show to each other. This is how we come to know God, and to know that God is love. The depth and power of the three words "God is love" are often lost on us because of the abundance of contradicting conceptions of love all around us. We tend to forget that it is God's love for us that that makes it possible for us to love one another.

It all begins with God's love. God is the source and the definition of love. God is love. God loves as the sun shines: love expresses who God is. There is a saying: God's love is like the ocean, you can see its beginning but not its end.

We were "born of God" with knowing God's character (4:7). God's children have an intimate relationship with God and thus are deeply acquainted with God's love. In saying that "everyone who loves is born of God and knows God," the author of John 1 suggests that God's children cannot help but love because they are so intimately in fellowship with God.

First John, however, speaks of love in a specific, distinctly Christian way. Love is not God, but God is love, meaning that believers are to understand love on God's terms and according to God's character. If we know God, then we will show God through our love for others. Divine love manifested most perfectly through the love of God in Christ is a reality that God desires us to know, see, inhabit, and share. God's love is not some abstract concept. It is passion expressed in action. God made love real and present by sending Jesus to live among us and to die for us. God continues to show us love through Jesus' life-giving presence among us.

When God perfects his love in us, it means that God's intended purpose for loving us is fulfilled when we extend the love to others. If ever we should question whether God truly does love us, the gift and witness of the Holy Spirit confirmed it: we are God's beloved. God's love is a truth more basic and reliable than the ground we walk on and the air we breathe.

God's love does not depend on our initiative or on our worthiness. We don't have to clean up our act before God can love us. We don't have to measure up to some standard in order to be lovable. Instead God showers love on us whether we deserve it or not. In the Gospel of John, when Jesus was preparing his disciples for his departure, he comforted them and asked the Father to give them a comforter, The Holy Spirit; he also gave them a new commandment:

A new commandment I am giving to you: that you should love one another just as I loved you so that also you should love one another. In this everyone will know that you are my disciples: if you should have love for one another. (John 13:34-35)

Let us therefore remember that God loved us not because we had something to offer him, but rather because He had something to offer us. "For God loved the world in this way: He gave His One and Only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). God loved us so that He could demonstrate His mercy to us in the person of His Son. Even though we have the freedom to set our own priorities, Jesus made a point of defining certain ones of them for us: "' Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with your entire mind.' This is the greatest and most important commandment. The second is like love your neighbour as yourself, love then is not a grey area in the scriptures. Jesus love gave priority over all the Christian virtues, every thought, response and act of good will, will be done with love, or it means nothing at all.

However, we still cannot see God because only Jesus the Son has seen the Father (4:12; see also John 1:18; 5:37; 6:46). There will be a day when "we will see him as he is" (3:2). But until then, the invisible God makes himself visible in Christian love. When we love in response to God's love for us, "his love is perfected in us" There is no fear in love, perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and therefore whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also." Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers or sisters, are not telling the truth; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. When we demonstrate Christian love, it distinguishes believers from the rest of the world. John 4 goes on to say, "By this love all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35).

Let us rejoice and praise God, and show his love for us in our actions towards our neighbours and in our communities; we are Christ's hand and feet, ready to go forward in faith. Amen

Help us to be inspired by justice,

to seek to serve rather than be served,

and to be bold in challenging the status quo when it needs to be challenged.
